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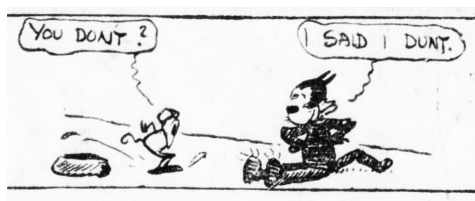




George Herriman (1880–1944) began drawing tales of Krazy Kat, Ignatz Mouse, and Offisa Pupp in 1910, under contract with Hearst's King Features Syndicate.
