Your praise of Bryan Garner's neat handwriting (see 25 Green Bag 2d 3) brings to mind the most infamous example of lexicographical error caused by poor penmanship, Webster's Second's "Dord," a misreading of "D or d" (abbreviations for "density") as a word without any etymology. It lay undetected for five years before being removed. Webster's Third's editor, Philip Gove, later said that the removal was "[p]robably too bad, for why shouldn't dord mean density." Some of us still bemoan the loss.
