SUBMISSIONS: We welcome unsolicited manuscripts, preferring submissions via email to editors@greenbag.org. We also accept diskettes, and will consider hardcopy submissions in cases of hardship. We accept material that is short, clear, interesting, and law-related – up to 5,000 words, and 0 to 50 footnotes. We especially encourage the submission of poetry, anecdotes, cartoons, and other miscellany.

LETTERS: We welcome letters, which we subject to the same standards as submissions (who would wish to read a letter with more than 50 footnotes?).

DEADLINES: August 1 for the Autumn issue; November 1


for Winter; February 1 for Spring; May 1 for Summer.

DEALING WITH AUTHORITY: Citations should be accurate, complete, and unobtrusive. Familiar cases may need no citation. Most important, our readers should be able to find the authorities on which our authors rely. Authors may use whatever citation form they prefer; we will make changes only where necessary for our readers' ease or to keep footnotes from looking like goulash. Incidentally, the preferred citation form for any article published in the *Green Bag, Second Series*, is __ GREEN BAG 2D __ (19__).
