


**DEADLINES:** August 1 for the Autumn issue; November 1 for Winter; February 1 for Spring; May 1 for Summer.

**DEALING WITH AUTHORITY:** Citations should be accurate and unobtrusive. Authors may use any form they like; we edit only to keep footnotes from looking like goulash. Familiar sources need no citation.

**COPYRIGHT:** If a copyright notice appears in an author note, you must get permission to reproduce from the author. Otherwise, we hold the copyright, and you may duplicate such items for classroom use, if you (1) distribute copies at or below the cost of reproduction; (2) identify the author and the *Green Bag*; (3) affix proper copyright notice to each copy; and (4) notify us. Other copying, including electronic, requires advance written permission.
